Dear Mr. Pachecker:

I am writing to summarize our conversations earlier this month regarding the National Association for Foreign Attorneys (NAFA).

As we discussed, I am very concerned that NAFA members may inadvertently be engaged in the unlicensed practice of law in Florida. As you know, an attorney who is not a member of the Florida Bar may not practice Florida law and may not hold himself out to be a Florida attorney. Furthermore, certified foreign legal consultants may practice only the law of the countries in which they are attorneys, and may not hold themselves out to be Florida attorneys.

As Professor Rosenn and I both told you, it is important that foreign attorneys who are interested in participating in our foreign graduate program communicate directly with us and obtain whatever information and material, including the brochure and application, they need directly from us. It is inappropriate and unacceptable for you to be providing our material and forms to them as part of NAFA's services to its members. Thus, I hereby request that you immediately cease sending our material to interested candidates. Needless to say, the disclaimer notice which you have added to the NAFA brochure is unacceptable insofar as it indicates that NAFA will be sending out University of Miami School of Law forms and information.
